


1. Lift front of record jacket and allow it to swing open.



2. Open completely to form theater.






 - Fold along dotted, scored lines so that actors and props will stand erect.








Not only is the youngster engaging in imaginative play activity, he can be encouraged to dramatize stories of his own continuations of stories on the record, or entirely new ones . . . His creative abilities will be activated and shared intimately with you.

The record itself is number seven in a series that has elevated its creators, Jim Copp and Ed Brown, to a pinnacle in the field of children's recordings.

Its setting is a theater, its audience the wildly vociferous people and animals from the Flumdiddle world of Copp and Brown. In the theater wings many Copp-Brown favorites stand waiting to come on stage.
