TONGUE-WITH-CHEEK or Sham-on-Wry, if your taste buds differ, is a collection of songs out of the past out of the blue.

The matched pair (on our front Cover) are working up to a single thought. The statuesque surveys the world around her. The dreamer is apparently reaching for the heights. Where and how they meet and why can be described simply, clearly, wisely. The material in TONGUE-WITH-CHEEK serves as a short course.

TONGUE-WITH-CHEEK also serves as a reminder of the talents of two of the most-fabled cafe entertainers of the past generation. New York columnists speak of the *smart cafe* as the *intime* supper club where the elite meet to (a) be amused by adult-mannered entertainers (b) amuse each other in an adult manner.

Under Letter (a), Dwight Fiske and Nan Blackstone qualify as two most-amusing adult-mannered smart-cafe entertainers of all time. Their careers were individual, their material peculiarly their own. But their appeals were to the same kinds of audience (none of whom were ever very shocked at anything).

Dwight Fiske wrote and sang his own songs—songs his mother never taught him. His career (the launching was in great measure due to Tallulah Bankhead) spanned more than two decades. The things he sang about spanned time. Senorita Margarita Del Campo is a story of

romance in Mexico. (Olé.) Case 142 is an incident or two in the career of Dr. Fry, Psychoanalyst, his couch and his turtle-shell. The Fourteenth Wedding Anniversary relates events that occur on a canoe trip. (The entire affair is upsettable and not for children of any age.) Mrs. Pettibone and Dwight Fiske were synonymous expressions of adult (erous) thought. The Mrs. was a wealthy widow with a knowledgeable public. (N'est-ce-pas!)

Nan Blackstone wrote and sang her own songs—songs of a hush-hush nature—and parodies of other composers' works. She dispensed information on a variety of subjects, from Life On Donkey Island (where folk made asses of themselves) to He Should Have Been A Wac (a song of similar vein). Let's Fall In Love leaves less doubt about its meaning than did the original intent. Blackstone's Secret Passion and Torch Song are almost (though not quite) self-descriptive from the titles and My Boy Friend Elmer leaves little doubt about how overrated fresh air can be.

TONGUE-WITH-CHEEK brings total recall about the special effects of the memoried Dwight Fiske and the memoried Nan Blackstone. Whatever side you're on—Male; Female or Malefemale—you'll find the subject of S—— disclosed with a slight measure of whimsy and a large helping of o-o-o-o-o-!
