TOKYO, A CITY OF NINE MILLION, offers inexhaustible sources of amusement—kabuki, noh, bunraku, Western-style concerts, opera and theater, night clubs, sporting events of every type, bazaars, gambling, movies, baths, etc. But on a rainy night?

When the streets are wet and the neon signs flash on and off half-heartedly as if they were talking to their own reflec-tions, the quiet pleasures of Japanese life call you indoors. On such a night you might savor most fully the subtle delights of Japanese cooking and gracious manners. And you might relax with simpático companionship in comfortable Japanese-style garments, drinking warm sake to the nostalgic accompaniment of shamisen or koto.

Moments of such peaceful well-being are rare for mortal men, especially Westerners. But the mood of modern Japanese cosmopolitanism combined with centuries-old charm is something that you can achieve by lowering a tone arm—on this album.

Here are appealing traditional melodies, some of them three hundred years old and still among the most popular with the Japanese. This is the music of nagauta, simple and tuneful pieces often played by geisha girls or non-professional musicians. It is the music of informal dancing and of small parties, of relaxation and contemplation.

The versatile young Tokyo musician Hachidai Nakamura has arranged these melodies freely, setting behind the authentic Japanese instruments of nagauta a modern, rich-sounding string orchestra, with added percussion for color. The result is a unique blend of ancient and modern, in moods of both mystery and cheerfulness.

Among the Japanese instruments heard in this album are the SHAMISEN, which looks and sounds something like a banjo (featured in Aki no Irokusa); the KOTO, a softer-toned stringed instrument that stretches out along the floor and is capable of many lush effects (featured in Sakura Sakura); two Japanese flutes—the smaller FUE (heard in Haru-same) and the larger SHAKUHACHI (heard in Sada Okesa); and the TSUZUMI, a hand drum with changeable pitch (also heard in Haru-same).

Many of the melodies describe a mood of nature; through his smooth and imaginative arrangements young Mr. Nakamura has deftly added a sensuous beauty to these atmospheric pieces. For a rainy night in Tokyo or anywhere else there could be no more exotic and enjoyable blanket of sound to snuggle into than this album.
