It's based on a novel by Evan Hunter . . . about four young people during the course of a summer on Fire Island, and what happens to them . . . it's just the most heart-stopping movie . . . the best picture I've ever seen on the subject of youth . . . There's never been a movie like Last Summer . . . It's a marvelous picture, and I think anybody with any serious interest in where movies are going must see this pic-

If Rex Reed seemed slightly breathless while reviewing Last Summer on Bill Mazer's WOR radio show, it's not without good cause. The film has already become one of this year's most talked about sensations, following the successful precedent of Frank Perry's The Swimmer and David and Lisa.

When it came time to score the highly idiomatic film, many prominent composers were considered. The theme and spirit of the story, though, demanded that the music be done by someone who was highly communicative in contemporary musical terms. John Simon was the ideal choice.

The young composer-performer-producer had already made an impression with his score for *You Are What You Eat.* In addition, he has worked with some of the country's top performers, including Big Brother & The Holding Company; Blood, Sweat and Tears; "Mama Cass" Elliott; and Leonard Cohen.

It was decided that Simon's music should be more than just

sweeping strings playing tuneless background themes or occasional sound effects on some soulless electronic wonder. The music should be, in fact, another member of the cast. With that in mind, several separate and distinct songs were written, to be performed by a number of talented individuals under Simon's supervision. The result is a highly memorable score, and one that holds up remarkably well when separated from the film for which

it was created.

Among the performers on this album are: Henry Diltz — banjoist-singer, formerly with the Modern Folk Quintet, now a respected session musician and photographer.

Ray Draper — jazz tuba player and vocalist with Epic Records' Red Beans & Rice.

Colin Walcott — disciple of Ravi Shankar and a fine sitarist in his own right.

Buddy Bruno — young singer of tremendous potential, discovered by John Simon.

Cyrus Faryar — singer, instrumentalist, and producer; has been with the Modern Folk Quintet and Whiskyhill Singers, now a prominent session man.

Bad Kharma Dan & The Bicycle Brothers — an outlaw motorcycle gang from Le Grange, Illinois.

The Electric Meatball — an acid-rock group with a difference: theirs is hydrochloric and granite.

Aunt Mary's Transcendental Slip & Lurch Band — the latest of the prefabricated studio rock and roll groups; their TV show selfdestructed shortly before launching.

While some of the musicians, for contractual reasons, must re-

main anonymous, their music speaks for itself. Last Summer is an uncommon film. This is an uncommonly fine soundtrack album. Todd Everett
