Temple City Kazoo Orchestra leader David Humms graduated from the Berkely Conservatory of Music in 1974, majoring in Kazoology. For his thesis, he transposed all nine of Beethoven's symphonies so that they could be played on kazoo. He also wrote a number of original kazoo compositions including "Symphony for a Soggy Doodle" and "The Tooty Fuguey". Returning to his native Temple City, David decided that an organization was needed to protect and promote "this country's most maligned instrument", and formed the TCKO. After months of practice, the 23 piece orchestra entered the Temple City Kiwanis Club's annual talent contest and finished second, losing to a woman who played "Pankee Doodle" on her false teeth. Soon the TCKO was playing weekly classical music concerts at the Temple City Women's Auxiliary Club, but were fired when they encored one of their performances with a rendition of Simon and Garfunkle's "It's All Happening at the Kazoo". Banned from playing in their hometown, David decided that playing hard rock songs was the only way he could keep the orchestra financially solvent. Subsequently, he recorded "Whole Lotta Love" for Rhino Records and the rest is history.

Currently, David is leading kazoo workshops at the TCKO studios and at the present time has over 74 students. David's main complaint about his pupils is their lack of discipline. "Although the kazoo looks deceptively easy to play," David is constantly preaching, "it is without a doubt the most difficult of all instruments to master properly."
